1. Introduction

This report highlights the key points of the Validation Workshop Report for the Social Accountability Coalition's (SAC) Strategic Plan 2025-2027. The main objective of the workshop was to ensure the strategic plan's effectiveness by testing its alignment with the agreed-upon MoU

- 2. Session I
- 2.1. Welcoming Remarks and Opening Remarks
- a) Preliminaries

Mr. Endris Yesuf, Project Management, and Partnership Team Leader kicked off the Validation workshop at 4:00 a.m., welcoming participants and handing over the program to Mrs. Yeshembet, VNG Representative and the day's leader. Mrs. Yeshembet suggested that the participants introduce themselves, stating the name of the institution they represented.

b) Welcoming remarks by the Executive Director

Dr. Mekuriaw, Executive Director, expresses his delight at seeing so many participants eager to contribute to the network's future and adds that the workshop will be a key step forward in the NaSAC and INGOs' journeys.

Dr. Mekuriaw emphasizes that "we are assembled here for two primary reasons. The first is to seek shared aims in the areas of social accountability (SA) between two national CSOs: NaSAC and ECSOC formed a coalition with seven foreign NGOs. Thus, we're here to validate this coalition's strategic direction and guarantee it aligns with the vision and goals of our respective organizations." In keeping with his remark, he emphasized that the participants' contributions and engagement were critical to the success of this workshop and, eventually, the consortium.

 Opening Remarks by the Director of FDRE Authority for Civil Society Organizations (ACSO)

Mr. Samson Biratu, General Director, welcomed the workshop participants and mentioned that the National Social Accountability Consortium (NaSAC) has achieved great success in social accountability within its legal jurisdiction in a short period since its establishment. He notes that its existence is acknowledged by major stakeholders such as ACSO and INGOs, indicating its future potential for enhancing accountability throughout the country. The General Director boldly stated that ACSO will do its best to strengthen NaSAC following the proclamation 1113/2019. Today's validation session could be interpreted as an indication of such promises. Of course, he added that NaSAC was sponsored by ACSO from its origin to its formal establishment. In this light, the General Director informed the participants that, in consultation with donors such as the World Bank, the Agency had decided to assist NaSAC in a long-term fashion so that NaSAC's program is community-based and provides citizens with equal access to

basic social services.

2.2. Objectives of the Workshop

Mr. Endris Yesuf, ACSO's Project Management and Partnership team leader, highlighted the workshop objectives as follows:

- > To consolidate NaSAC for the implementation of its program
- ➤ To create an enabling opportunity for the signatory parties of SA Coalition for the validation of their strategic plan 2025-2027.
- > To engage stakeholders in giving comments and feedback on the reviewed strategic plan and the journey of NaSAC
- 3. Session II: Presentations
- 3.1.Presentation of NaSAC Journey

The Executive Director highlighted NaSAC's profile from its initiation to its establishment and accomplished major activities. He stressed that NaSAC is a network of 25 CSOs in Ethiopia and is focusing on Social Accountability and governance, initiated on December 29, 2023, and accorded its legal personality on June 24, 2024, with a vision to see a society in which all citizens have equal access to quality and inclusive basic social services that enables them to develop their capacity and actively participate in national development. NaSAC is not

created within an empty bottle. Rather, it is a network and a successor that will perpetuate Ethiopia's Social Accountability initiative, which has been executed in three phases since 2006 and is owned by the Ministry of Finance but guided by the Management Agency. Thus, NaSAC is motivated not only by the unique approach of its founding members but also by the lessons and experiences gained from ESAP3 and other stakeholders. The Director further stated that NaSAC can make an impact through its ranking system, its prominent member CSOs, the Marching system, and its succeeding 417 WSA Committee (Woreda Social Accountability Committee). Since its establishment, NaSAC carried out key activities attached in the appendices.

3.2. Presentation of Localization Humanitarian Action

Mr. Nigussie Tefera, CCRDA NNGO Humanitarian Forum Coordinator GF HIV Grant Coordinator, presented the research titled "ASSESSMENT ON THE PROGRESS OF LOCALIZATION PRACTICES, CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES IN ETHIOPI". He highlighted the historical and current trends in localization, as well as the study findings and recommendable remedies. More crucially, he briefly discusses the intertwined pillars of localization links, which are Local Ownership, Capacity Building, Contextualization: Inclusivity, Transparency, and Partnership.

3.3. Presentation of SAC Strategic Plan

Mr. Sisay Getachew, former VNG Int Capacity Building team leader and current volunteer Technical Strategic Advisor to NaSAC, delivered a paper titled "The Coalition's Role in Addressing the Effects of Funding Challenges on SA and Service Delivery". Mr. Sisay recounted the history of ESAP3, which has grown into a movement in Ethiopia, owing mostly to the three phases of the ESAP, all of which were designed to develop SA systems and mechanisms-platforms for citizen interaction aimed at improving service delivery at the local level. Finally, he left storming questions for debate.

Session III: Presentation of Strategic Plan

Mr. Betsegaw Botamo, Accountability Manager of Concern Worldwide in Ethiopia, delivered a paper titled "Strategic Plan for Social Accountability Coalition". He clearly stated that effective relationships between foreign non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and local NGOs are critical to the successful delivery of humanitarian aid and development support. Creating a Social accountability coalition with INGOs is vital for local CSOs like NaSAC and ECSOC to pool resources, share expertise, amplify their collective voice, and leverage diverse perspectives

to address complex social issues more effectively, ultimately enhancing their impact and influence. In consonance with this, today's validation workshop on the SA Coalition Strategic Plan ensures the joint effort of INGOs and Local CSOs.

Presentation of Strategic Plan: Continued by Dr Mekuriaw

Dr. Mekuriaw addressed the SA Coalition's past and present status. He added that the Transitional Task Force (TTF) was formed as an advisory committee after consulting with the signatories. Finally, the TTF developed the outcome framework, which has been finished by anticipating that each signatory body will align its organization's annual and strategic plans with the described main activities.



4. Session III: Plenary

This session was moderated by Mrs. Yeshemebet. The plenary focused on the three presentations but more focused on the strategic plan of SAC, questions from the participants and their comments.

4.1. Issues/observations raised

- ✓ Local NGOs should focus on local market prospects to earn cash instead of relying on donors.
- ✓ ACSO should support the movement of IGA, promote volunteerism, and develop a mechanism for CSOs to thrive in the social kingdom.
- ✓ The need to align the strategic plan 2025-2027 with the requirements of the NaSAC members;
- ✓ Why did not the signatories of the Grand Bargain and Localization Commitments fulfill their promises?
- ✓ The strategy plan drafted by seven international organizations and two national CSOs is well-prepared and seems like based on their organizational interests, making it feasible for implementation.
- ✓ The strategic plan clearly articulates its basic values, vision, goals, and objectives.
- ✓ The study on localization offers new ideas and should continue to be shared as part of capacity building for civil society organizations.

- ✓ The initiative called *the intelligence stand committee* releases updates on localization. Thus, we can learn about localization patterns from such a platform.
- ✓ At a global level, what looks like participation in a coalition, alliance, and network?
- ✓ To ensure sustainability, we must shift from a single polar fund to a multi-diversification fund and work together to mitigate risks.
- ✓ The FDRE government's localization policy offers opportunities to support CSOs through collaboration with working groups and platforms, including the Humanitarian CSOs Forum.
- ✓ The Ministry of Revenue has a regulation that states those CSOs supporting the community on a volunteer base are free from tax-exempted
- ✓ When you formed such SA Coalition (SAC) what was your context analysis?
- ✓ How to address the root causes of social accountability in Ethiopia
- ✓ How is donor mapping designed when you establish the coalition?
- ✓ In what way do our communities be engaged in such a SA Coalition
- ✓ Currently our financial system from the donor perspective is at risk and we need to think in a stable and saturated manner.
- ✓ The government should take some lessons from neighboring countries like Kenya where everybody has the right to get a license to engage any IGA without ups and downs.
- ✓ In today's global competitiveness, CSOs must consider localization and survival strategies against major donors such as USAID that withdraw from humanitarian and development aid programs.
- ✓ We have to consider PESTL and SWOT analysis when we prepare such a Coalition strategic plan
- ✓ The activity implemented should be recognized by the network members and other key stakeholders, in this regard preparing such a validation workshop takes paramount importance.
- ✓ As a coalition we have not only thought about social accountability, but we have also thought with the perspective of Nexus with peace.
- ✓ Although there was a rumor of a tax exemption for CSOs at the practical stage, it had not yet been implemented.
- ✓ The SAC strategic plan is fascinating. The three speakers should be congratulated for their exact and straightforward approach, as well as their dedication of time and skill.
- ✓ We have to work on the capacity of IGA for CSOs
- ✓ We have to get solutions on how to own their building office
- ✓ We have to work hand in hand to get common solutions
- ✓ The NaSAC should keep up with such strength

- ✓ As CSOs, we have to think out of the window and find a way how sustain ourselves in the long term and help the community at the grassroots level.
- ✓ The office of ACSO is always open to support such SA Coalitions in different menses.
- ✓ We have to focus on IGA since the financial aid flow in the world is uncertain
- ✓ Mr. Fasikaw thanked the participants for attending the Workshop.
